

## EJGC Planting areas

### REGC Escarpment

24<sup>th</sup> May 2022

REGC Escarpment is an east- and north-facing slope above the Royal Eastbourne Golf Club.

This section of the slope is only seen from a distance – there are no paths through it.



Space	Species
RE1	500 metres of the top of the escarpment, so trees which form the skyline and will get blown about a bit. 125 trees. 25 hornbeam, 25 sweet chestnut, 25 yew, 25 field maple, 25 whitebeam
RE2	0.3ha, 500 populus alba, 800 whitebeam, 200 Pinus sylvestris
RE3	0.3ha, 500 wild pear and 1,000 whitebeam whips
RE4	0.4ha, 1800 tilia cordata whips and 200 Cupressus macrocarpa
RE5	0.7ha, The Coastal Schools Partnership site, together with the RA and RB areas below. 100 tall trees: 10 each of elm, Quercus canariensis, copper beech, field maple, Alnus cordata, horse chestnut, sweet chestnut, lime, birch, aspen
RE6	1.3ha, 6,500 whips: 400 elms (various including glabra atropurpurea), 50 Quercus robur, 400 beech and 50 copper beech, 800 field maple, 800 hornbeam, 1200 hazel, 100 alnus cordata, 200 Carya ovata, 300 sweet chestnut, 200 Pinus nigra, 200 black walnut, 100 sorbus torminalis, 300 lime, 400 Prunus avium, 50 yew, 150 holly, 300 hawthorn, 300 spindle, 200 salix caprea
RE7	1.7ha, 400 prunus saplings on the edge; 100 Cedrus deodara saplings in the deep, along with 3,000 prunus whips and 3,000 shrubs. // North edge Prunus saplings: 20 Cerasus, 20 domestica, 20 subhirtella, 20 incisa, 30 domestica insititia, 30 spinosa. Backed by 40 sargentii, 40 cerasifera, 60 avium. South edge 10 dulcis, 110 avium (sweet fruiting varieties). In the deep: 100 Cedrus deodara. Whips: 1,000 prunus avium, 1,000 prunus cerasifea, 1,000 Prunus domestica insititia, 1,000 Prunus spinosa, 1,000 Elder, 1,000 Hawthorn
